### 2) Play based on knowledge

If your players are small herpetologists (scientists that study amphibians), then have them cross off what they already know. Have them share the facts they did not know and move on to the next activities.





# AMPHIBIAN




## MATERIALS

- 2 eggs
- Pot or saucepan
- Water
- Food colouring

STEP 2- REMOVE SHELL FROM— ONE OF THE EGGS. PLACE BOTH EGGS IN A GLASS JAR OR BOWL



STEP 2- ADD FOOD COLOURING TO BOTH EGGS. LET EGGS SIT FOR 2 HOURS



### STEP 1- HARD BOIL EGGS

- 1. Put eggs in water and cover with water so that there is about an inch of water above the eggs
- 2. Bring water to a boil and let eggs sit for 10-12 minutes
- 3. Drain water and let eggs cool completely

### HYPOTHESIS!

You will be adding food colouring to both eggs, what do you think will happen to:

The egg with the shell?

The egg without the shell?

### SO WHAT HAPPENED?

The egg without the shell is like the skin of an amphibian. It absorbs whatever is in the water around it. That means that any pollution in the water will also be absorbed into its skin. The egg with the shell is like other animals, with scales or fur. It protects them from the environment around them.



Amphibians live in many different environments. Some amphibians like frogs live near ponds. Some like salamanders live under large rocks and logs. You are going to make a small habitat to attract toads to your backyard!

# MATERIALS

- Plastic bottle
- Scissors
- Hot glue
- Natural Material (rocks, grass, leaves, moss, etc...)



- Cut your plastic bottle in half.
- Use the bottom half of the bottle and flip it upside down.
- 3. Cut a little door in the bottle
- 4. Glue your natural material all over the outside of the pot.
- Place it in a spot in your backyard where it blends in with the environment.
