

## Binbrook Conservation Area 2020 Season - Controlled Waterfowl Hunting

The Niagara Peninsula Conservation Authority (NPCA) is pleased to offer the Controlled Waterfowl Hunt at Binbrook Conservation Area for another year.

For the 2020 waterfowl season, hunting will be offered at Binbrook Conservation Area **on Saturdays** from **September 26 through December 12, 2020** (during unfrozen lake conditions and excluding Thanksgiving Monday). All hunting is **from nine designated hunting blinds**, and a lottery/draw will be held to reserve hunting blinds for the first two weeks of the waterfowl season.

The fees and lottery draw in effect include:

- i) hunting fees at \$40 + tax /blind/day (maximum of 2 people per blind)
- ii) a lottery/draw to reserve the use of hunting blinds for the first two weeks of the season (September 26 through October 3). Failure to pay will result in loss of lottery eligibility in 2021
- iii) a lottery/draw to reserve the use of hunting blind #5 from October 10 through December 12, 2020
- iv) Prepayment is required by Visa, or Mastercard. Payment is charged to the credit card only when an individual is drawn for a hunting blind
- v) all hunting blind(s) payments are non-refundable
- vi) a hunting harvest report must be completed and returned to the gatehouse at the end of each hunting day to remain eligible for the 2020 hunting lottery
- vii) a **boat is required for all hunting blinds.** Boat rental is available on site should you need it
- viii) Hunting Blind Registration and Access from 5 a.m. to 6 a.m. only. Hunting until 12 noon. Park Gate closes <u>sharply at 1 p.m.</u>
- ix) subject to changes

To submit your name for the lottery please complete the form below and **return** it by mail, email, facsimile, or in person, to the NPCA office no later than **August 31, 2020.** All successful applicants will be notified of the results by regular mail/email.

# **Notice for Hunting**

### Practices for Reducing the Spread of COVID-19

In response to the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic, and to limit the spread of illness, **the following protocols will be upheld through the 2020 Waterfowl Hunting Season.** Please note that this list is not exhaustive, and additional measures may be required for the fall season. Updates will be provided in advance of the season.

- Hunters are not permitted to enter the Conservation Area if they have come into a known or probable case of COVID-19, have travelled outside of Canada in the last 14 days, or if they are experiencing any of the following symptoms:
  - o fever (feeling hot to the touch, a temperature of 37.8 degrees Celsius or higher)
  - o chills
  - o cough that's new or worsening (continuous, more than usual)
  - o barking cough, making a whistling noise when breathing (croup)
  - o shortness of breath (out of breath, unable to breathe deeply)
  - o sore throat
  - o difficulty swallowing
  - runny, stuffy or congested nose (not related to seasonal allergies or other known causes or conditions)
  - o lost sense of taste or smell
  - o pink eye (conjunctivitis)
  - o headache that's unusual or long lasting
  - o digestive issues (nausea/vomiting, diarrhea, stomach pain)
  - o muscle aches
  - o extreme tiredness that is unusual (fatigue, lack of energy)
  - o falling down often
- Hunters are reminded to practice appropriate hand hygiene and to bring their own hand sanitizer (handwashing stations and sanitizer will not be provided)
- Maintain physical distancing where possible and follow provincial guidelines regarding times when distancing cannot be maintained (i.e. people are advised to wear a mask)
- · Practice cough and sneeze etiquette by covering your cough or sneeze with a tissue or your sleeve
- All litter and waste must be removed from hunting blinds after use, please dispose of litter appropriately in marked receptacles in the conservation area, or take it home to dispose
- Post NPCA Waterfowl Hunting Lottery: Contactless payment and booking will be available by contacting Binbrook Conservation Area directly by phone
